



Munich Beer & Food Experiences

Munich is the beer capital of the world and famous for its traditional, mouth-watering foods. While exploring the city, walk to the Viktualienmarkt local food market, which has been supplying Munich with high-quality food and drinks for 200 years. Enjoy samples of delicious specialties such as *asobatzda*, a traditional soft-cheese dish composed of Camembert and butter, seasoned with paprika and other peppers; *weisswurst*, a seasoned white veal sausage accompanied with a pretzel and sweet mustard; and *auszogne*, a freshly prepared typical Bavarian dessert of fried dough pastry smothered in sugar.

Taking place over two weeks in late September and early October, Oktoberfest has grown into the world's largest beer festival and attracts millions of visitors from across the world each year.
