



Mosel & Rheingau Regions Wine Experiences

Its sloping vineyards, medieval castles and hilltop villages are undeniably picturesque, but the Rheingau region and the neighboring Mosel Valley are most famous for their celebrated Riesling wines. Stretching along the northern banks of the mighty Rhine River, the Rheingau region runs west of Mainz from the town of Hochheim to Lorch, just north of Rudesheim, and is acclaimed as one of Germany's smallest, but most important wine growing regions. The Mosel River connects with the Rhine at Koblenz. Most day tours to the region begin in Frankfurt.

Here are a few ideas of what you can experience in the Rhine Valley

Heidelberg and Rhine Valley Wine tasting and Dinner – 11 Hours

From Frankfurt: Visit two of Germany's most charming places on a full-day trip from Frankfurt. With an expert guide to show you around Heidelberg, you'll explore the ruins at Heidelberg Castle and see its medieval Old Town, the Karl Theodor Bridge and Heidelberg University. Your afternoon is spent discovering the UNESCO World Heritage-listed stretch of the Rhine River Valley, where you'll embark on a River Rhine cruise before enjoying a local wine-tasting session and dinner.

Rhine Valley Cruise with Wine Tasting – 11 Hours

From Frankfurt: See the best of Germany's Rhine River Valley on a half-day or full-day trip from Frankfurt. As a time-friendly way to see the Rhine Valley, both trips include a must-do Rhine River cruise and local wine-tasting session amid stunning scenery.

Mosel Valley Cruise with Wine Tasting – 10 Hours
